- 3. A resume of your school activities, community activities and employment during high school. Please include your name, street & email address, and phone number.
- 4. An official copy of your Cut Bank High School transcript through the 7th semester.
- 5. ACT Test Results obtained from the high school counseling center.
- 6. Two CBHS teacher assessment forms, not letters, from CBHS classroom teachers who have taught you and are currently teaching at Cut Bank High School. At least one of these forms must be from a teacher of a CORE requirement course. This does not include coaches, aides or School-To-Work employers unless they actually taught the applicant in a classroom setting during high school. Assessments written by a relative of the applicant will not be considered. These forms are provided for you at the end of this application and the teacher will give the completed assessment directly to the CBEFAA office. The completed assessments WILL NOT be given to the student applicant.
- 7. One letter of recommendation from a community or business member. Recommendations written by a relative of the applicant will not be considered.
- 8. A short essay (250 words or less) on your Most Influential Teacher/Staff Person. The CBEFAA would like to know which teacher/staff member in the Cut Bank School District; grades K-12 had the greatest impact on your education and life. Scholarship recipients will read aloud this essay at the scholarship awards reception in April. Feel free to consider a teacher, aide, secretary, principal, superintendent, custodian or lunch staff that may have influenced you while in the Cut Bank School System.
- 9. Students applying for the Community Service Scholarships need to attach a community service record sheet for the additional items that must be submitted to be considered for these scholarships.

The effort you put into this application is a direct indicator of how prepared you are for the next step in your educational journey and will be used in determining if you will be awarded any scholarships.

The deadline for this application is 4:00 p.m. Monday, February 3, 2025. **No late applications will be accepted.** All applications must be turned into the CBEFAA office located in the Central office before this deadline. COMMUNITY SERVICE SCHOLARSHIPS



The recipients will receive either \$1,000 given in memory of Mr. Ray Maier, a former teacher at CBHS or \$1,000 given in memory of CBHS alumnus R. Paul Kleinsmith, Class 0f '43.

Eligibility – CBHS graduating senior in good standing, who has <u>volunteered</u> at least 100 hours of service between **February 6, 2024 thru February 5, 2025**. No minimum grade point average is required. Applicant must plan to enroll in an accredited U.S. college or university.

What Types of Service Qualify –The Community Service Scholarships are intended to reward and encourage activities that have a significant impact in meeting the needs of our local community. Types of service include:

- service with community or religious organizations
- service through school or community based service-learning projects; or
- individual efforts to help others and improve the local community

What Types of Services DO NOT Qualify - Fund raising for yourself or for a school sport or club, lobbying, proselytizing, and paid or stipend service do not qualify for these awards. Court ordered community service does not qualify. Those activities for which the student received a grade and/or credit toward high school graduation (i.e., School-To-Work, Live Wire, yearbook, TA, etc.) do not qualify.



What to Submit in Order to be Considered – In addition to the items listed on the first page of this packet, all applicants for this scholarship must submit verification of all service claimed, signed off by an appropriate official of the organization for whom the service was performed. All time claimed by applicant must be accounted for. Please provide phone numbers of officials verifying service. The form must be legible & easy to read and include the organization worked for, the type of work performed, the dates and hours work performed, and signature of individual that can verify the service and a phone number. Do not submit individual letters verifying every hour worked. See Amy Overstreet for further clarification if needed.
